Brain tumour campaign mum is guest speaker

A MOTHER-OF-TWO from Ascot was a guest speaker at a Westminster event in London on Tuesday.

Bali Gill attended the Speaker's reception, which took place to honour the work of the brain tumour research group of charities.

She has been closely involved with the charity Brain Tumour Research Campaign (BTRC) a founder member of Brain Tumour Research, since tragically losing her husband Yashpal to a brain tumour in 2002.

Along with other campaigners, Bali lobbied MPs and others, demanding a better deal for people with brain tumours and to press the Government to allocate more cash.

The charity said that 16,000 people each year are diagnosed with a brain tumour in the UK.
